If you are looking for an exciting opportunity to expose your scouts to civics, citizenship, and the lawmaking process in New Jersey, then consider a trip to the New Jersey State House in Trenton.

The New Jersey State House, home to the Legislative and Executive branches of State Government since 1792, is the State's most important public building. Scouts will walk in the footsteps of Abraham Lincoln and Woodrow Wilson to learn about New Jersey's legislative process and how to participate in the shaping of public policy. Scouts will also discover the building's rich past and architectural history.

The tour of the State House is geared for both individual scouts or for entire troops, and is free of charge. One-hour guided tours are offered hourly, Monday through Friday, 10am - 3 pm & Saturday, 12pm - 3pm. Reservations are required for groups of ten or more. The State House is closed Sundays and State holidays. For more information and to make a reservation, please call us at (609) 633-2709.

Whether a scout is working on a badge requirement or just seeking to learn more about New Jersey, the State House tour promises to be an enjoyable educational experience.
