Trail to Eagle Camp Overview

Trail to Eagle Camp is a weeklong resident camp that will assist in achieving your goal of becoming an Eagle Scout. The program is designed to guide you through the advancement process and prepare you for your service project. Daily focused discussions with the leaders, staff and fellow troop members help explore your challenges and drive toward your Scouting goals. Trail to Eagle is open to Star and Life Scouts who are at least 13 years old by July 1st.

The Trail to Eagle troop resides in the Cheyenne campsite. The site has BSA wall tents on wooden platforms with two canvas cots in each tent. There is also a covered pavilion. Trail to Eagle Camp is supervised by a full time Scoutmaster and one or more assistant Scoutmasters who live in the site.

Pre Camp Orientation

There is no orientation or pre camp e-z check-in for Trail to Eagle Camp.

Arrival at Camp

Trail to Eagle check-in is at **12:30 pm on Sunday** in the parking lot. Our cheerful staff will be there to greet you. At check-in on Sunday, all personal gear will be transported from the parking lot to your campsite by camp vehicles.

Immediately after check-in, your Scout will participate in a medical re-check. Please plan to stay with your Scout until he completes the medical re-check.

Swim classification tests will be conducted after the medical re-check. Please arrive at camp with **swimsuits on under your uniforms**. Everyone should bring a small bag or day pack with towel, t-shirt, and socks so they can dry off after the swim test. The first meal will be dinner, so please eat lunch before arriving, or bring a bagged lunch.

Required Forms

Please be sure to have the following completed and signed forms. They are available on the website under the Trail to Eagle Confirmation Packet:

- **BSA Annual Health and Medical Record** - Required for all Scouts - Parts A, B and C must be completed and signed. Please bring photocopies and keep the originals.
- **Three Strikes Rule** – Parent must review and sign.
- **Completed Blue Cards signed by your scoutmaster** – If you wish to work on merit badges at camp, please bring a completed Application for Merit Badge (aka blue card) signed by your home troop Scoutmaster for each badge.
- **Picture Fees** - \$8.00 for an 8x10 Trail to Eagle group photo (optional).



Special Needs

Please inform us if your Scout has any special needs and let us know the specifics, i.e. physical, medical, dietary, food allergies, etc. Special requests and needs should be submitted as soon as possible so the camp staff can work with you. Feel free to call the camp at any time prior to camp to discuss any special needs. **Advance notice makes it much easier for us to meet special needs.**

Visitors

A week of camp goes by very quickly due to the myriad of projects and activities offered to each Scout. Scouts are in program from 9 am to 12 noon, 2 pm to 5 pm, and 7 pm to 9 pm – a very busy and rewarding experience. For this reason, the boy has little time for much else. Certainly, parents and friends are interested in what he is doing, and Scouts are encouraged to send postcards and letters telling of their experiences.

Feel free to contact the camp if you have any specific concerns about your son. Of course, we will always call the parent/guardian if their son is having any difficulties at camp.

Leaving Camp

Scouts are under the supervision of the Trail to Eagle leaders. Should a camper need to leave camp (family obligations, sports, etc.) they will be released to a parent/guardian, or other adult authorized in writing by the parent/guardian. The Patriots' Path Council will not release a Scout to an unauthorized adult. A sign-out/sign-in log is kept in the camp office and must be used by all adults or Scouts entering or leaving camp outside of the normal Sunday arrival or Saturday departure schedule.

Mail Service

Incoming Mail

All incoming mail will be available in your unit's box in the camp office. If parents want to send letters or packages to their sons, be sure they mail early. The Friday before camp is not too soon. The mailing address is:

Telephone Service

Incoming Calls

Scouts, and parents should be made aware that incoming calls to individuals are seldom practical due to the size of our camp.

In case of emergency, the camp office telephone number is (973) 983-9075. A message will be taken and delivered to the individual concerned as quickly as possible. Do not expect to talk to the person immediately.

Cell Phones

Cell phones are strongly discouraged for Trail to Eagle participants.



Lost and Found

All Patriots' Path Council camps will hold any items that are found in camp for a period one week. Medications, food, and perishables will be destroyed immediately. Articles may be retrieved by claiming the item in person at the camp office. Any item not claimed within the one week period will be discarded.

Saturday Departure

Please pick up your son at the camp office on Saturday between 9:00 and 10:00 am. Park in the parking lot, and walk to the camp office.

Each Scout should be sure to take home:

- Medical form
